## Class of 2021 Employment Report

The 2021 class for the University of Texas at Austin School of Information was composed of 34 responses from graduates from May and August 2021. Out of the 34 responses received, all were from the MSIS program. Responses were received from 34 out of 76 graduates, representing a 45% response rate, and graduates were surveyed via an online Qualtrics survey. The Career Development Office is attempting to redistribute the survey using different contact information for students, in an effort to increase the response rate and gather more data. The survey data is self-reported and the following results reflect aggregate responses to identify trends. Based on the data as it exists currently, employment outcomes were better than in 2020, and represent a different job market and approach to work than in 2019.

### Highlights

- **Employment**
  - School of Information graduates that responded to this survey continue to have strong employment prospects with **88%** reporting they were **employed full-time**, **12%** reporting they were **employed part-time**, and only **12%** reporting that they were **still seeking employment**.
- **Timeline**
  - Hiring timelines started to look more like they did in 2019, but are still slower than in previous years. **44%** of students were hired **before or around the time of their graduation**, **22%** were hired within **1-3 months** of graduation, and **34%** had to continue looking over **four months** past graduation. Last year (2020), 43% of respondents did not find a position until 4-6 months after graduation, and in 2019 73% of graduates secured employment prior to, or within, 3 months of graduation.
- **Job Satisfaction**
  - At the time of the survey, **94%** of our graduates reported being **satisfied in their positions**, which surpasses even the 2019 level of 80% satisfaction.
- **Location**
  - We've seen a steady increase of graduates staying in Texas – **88%** of reporting graduates accepted **positions in Texas** (compared to 77% in 2020 and 73% in 2019), and the rest of respondents stayed in the continental US, with the exception of 1 graduate who secured employment in Ukraine.
- **Salaries**
  - The overall **average salary** was **\$81,203**, up from both \$66,048 in 2020 and \$73,150 in 2019.
